From Pastor Hansen

"Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. ²⁹Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. ³⁰ For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light." (Matthew 11:28-30)

September Greetings to all of you!

I chose this passage from Matthew for a couple of reasons for this article. First of all, as we enter another round of mask mandates and the rise of the Delta variant of the Covid-19 virus, it has become stressful and anxiety producing to go backwards in our lives to social distancing and masks in public buildings. We had all hoped that by this time we would be ready to take off and soar into our fall programming with a pandemic behind us. However, we live in a world where people care about their own individual wants more than they care about their brothers' or sisters' needs and so here we are.

It is frustrating to see our handling of the virus become so political. In order to live and thrive in any sense of community there are rules that allow us to survive and flourish. We adhere to laws regarding seatbelts because they protect us. We have traffic lights that protect us from running into each other. We have cleanliness laws that tell us we cannot walk into a restaurant without shirt or shoes. We have all been vaccinated against other diseases that could have led to death, like polio, for example. What has made the handling of this virus different?

So as we enter into a new phase of a rising threat of the virus, our anxiety levels are high. This passage from Matthew just seems to make some sense to be reminded of who and whose we are. Being a follower of Jesus does not inoculate us from bad things. However, it does give us some perspective of our lives, the world, and the things that lead to a deep and meaningful life. In the midst of our anxiety we can be reminded that we are not alone. There is one who walks with us every step of the way. While our lives may seem anything but restful, it may be important to take pause and consider the companion who walks beside us. This Jesus is the one who knows what it means to suffer, to be betrayed, to lose his friends, and to die on behalf of others.

Living as a disciple of Jesus does not mean we are safe from bad things, but it does change our perspective from worrying about whether we can always get what we want to begin caring for the needs of our neighbors, and in doing so can begin to see new opportunities for hope. It just may give us the ability to be nimble to meet the ministry needs in the weeks and months to come. What might happen if we begin to consider others' needs before our own? How might that change your outlook? It just may be the freeing thing we need to relieve some anxiety along the way. We are in this together!

The second reason I chose this passage is that I wanted to thank you for the ability to take a sabbatical this fall. My hope is to look at ministry in a couple of ways. First, I'd like to look at how congregations can transition from a pastor-centered church to a programmatic or corporate congregation. It is important that we understand our role in

ministry is to grow our faith, to deepen our commitment to discipleship. It is how we live out our faith. Our worship attendance is vital to that growth and so I think it is important to help us find ways to gather that go beyond just being in a relationship with a pastor.

Pastor Seth and I are happy to get to know all of you, but the depth of relationship is hindered by the number of folks that call this place home. Our job is to help you grow in your faith. I am planning on interviewing a number of pastors from congregations that have gone through the transition to discover both challenges and successes. Secondly, I am going to be doing some reading and reflecting on how this pandemic has changed what ministry looks like. I am hoping to develop some way that we can address this as we hope to see some kind of ending in the next year.

Pastor Seth will be able to walk with you in your ministry while I am gone. He is a gifted pastor and I am sure that you have all come to appreciate his wisdom and bad jokes! I ask that you check in with him from time to time and volunteer to help in the needs of ministry that continue to go on.

May you know God's peace and presence in these strange days.

A "Normal" September Is Here? Not Quite.

In a typical September all choirs, children's groups through adult vocal groups, and handbells would begin regular weekly rehearsals. They would also begin to sing and play for worship. As recently as a month ago, it looked like the pandemic was finally at a manageable stage and that activities like choirs and other groups would be able to resume.

But this is not a typical year. The extremely contagious Delta variant of COVID-19 plus concerns about the level of vaccination rates have dashed our hopes for a return to what we perceive as "normal."


