

From Pastor Hecox

What a Month!

Some terrifying national events caused us to pause and reflect on our identity as a nation. Furthermore, these events caused some Christians, and especially pastors, all over the nation to question our role in the ugly developments we've all witnessed recently. What we find when we look honestly at the church's role in these developments isn't very flattering.

Each of us must ask ourselves how we got here, how we ourselves—and how we as a church—have contributed to the current national environment, and then ask what is a faithful response moving forward. These are not easy questions, and I don't expect we'll find very exciting responses as options. The work of being a people isn't easy: that goes for being a people with a shared government and for being a people with a shared faith identity.

While I'm not confident of satisfactory answers to these questions, I am increasingly confident that this process we must undertake will be more fruitful if we do it together. Trying to fix things unilaterally is seldom the best way. Attempting to build a better world by oneself is rarely productive. As the people of God, we have experience in collaboration and cooperation, and these things are needed now more than ever. When we realize that we are all in this together, and that you and I are inextricably linked to each other, we can assist each other in making sense of the past and the present. That will pay dividends in the future, I believe.

So we have a vital role to play moving forward. If the future is to hold any beauty or truth, we must talk to each other, listen to each other, and envision what that future might be. This work of mutual aid, of collective labor, is what opens the door to a viable future for us as a nation, and for us as a congregation, and even for us as a human race.

You can expect Pastor Tim and me to continue discussing our future with the various leadership teams at OSLC: the church council, church committees, task forces, staff, volunteers, and all sorts of groups in the church that provide valuable feedback, ideas, and possibilities for our collective future. Already, that teamwork has resulted in new ways of ministering and those programs have all started back up after our holiday break. That new and different work continues as we move toward Ash Wednesday, which has difficult questions of its own.

Ultimately, I am so proud of our faith family for adapting so well over the past 11 months and creating something beautiful together as we encountered event and event that was (to use a now-cliché term) "unprecedented." We can continue to do so, even into a new year, new month, new season of the church year. You are doing a great job—keep it up! Ask yourself the difficult questions, but acknowledge the faithful work you've already participated in. We will get through all this alongside each other, and we will be a stronger family of faith for it.

From Epiphany to Lent

The month of February sees the end of the season of Epiphany, with the Transfiguration of Our Lord to be celebrated on Sunday, February 14. We then enter the season of Lent on February 17 with the observance of Ash Wednesday. The date for Ash Wednesday is determined by the date of Easter, which is the first Sunday after the first full moon following the spring equinox. Easter Sunday in 2021 is on April 4. Then count back 40 days, but do not include Sundays and you will arrive at Wednesday, February 17. Parents, this calculation would be a good thing to work on with your children. You can explore the lunar schedule, the spring equinox, and some basic math.

In our nation, the month of February is also designated as Black History Month. I will feature, as much as possible, musical works by Black composers, both men and women, that relate to the readings and themes for the particular day.

We are excited about this new opportunity to be involved with a neighbor school in this way. We will begin collecting items for the pantry on Sundays this week. Below you will find a list of items that they are looking for. Thank you for your partnership!

Donations: food

Canned Meat or Fish- tuna, chicken, stew, chili, salmon, corned beef

Soups- chicken, vegetables, broth, chowder

Fresh/Canned Fruits and Vegetables- Oranges, apples, pineapples, mixed fruit, applesauce, grapes, celery, cabbage, greens (kale, collard, turnip, mustard), lettuce, corn, green beans, peas, mixed veggies, broccoli, cauliflower, beans (pinto, blackeyes, navy, black beans, baked)

Pasta/rice- boxed dinners (hamburger/tuna helper, macaroni and cheese, rice-a-roni, etc.)
