From Pastor Hansen

"We know that the whole creation has been groaning in labor pains until now; and not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the first fruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly while we wait for adoption, the redemption of our bodies. For in hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what is seen? But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience. Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but that very Spirit intercedes with sighs too deep for words. And God, who searches the heart, knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God." (Romans 8:22-27)

Dear Friends in Christ,

With the Day of Pentecost on the horizon this month, I am reminded of the second lesson from Paul's letter to the Romans. It is a great chapter that means so much to so many people. As you can imagine it is appropriate to meditate on this text in many situations. Have you ever been in a situation where you didn't know what to pray for? Sometimes situations arise where saying "yes" to something means saying "no" to something else. Sometimes it is about a dying parent who simply wants to die. How difficult is it to pray for someone in that situation. I remember my Grandpa living with us for a couple of months when he was 96. He was a relatively healthy man who took no medication, but he must have had an infection or something that made him feel lousy. One night I was called to his bed where he asked me to pray to God to take him home to be with my grandma. I remember being so sad. I could not pray that. I felt bad that I could not, but I was not ready. His infection gradually cleared and he went on to live for another 8 years! I remember this moment like it was yesterday because I was so perplexed about what I should pray for. This scripture passage from Romans became so helpful for me. I may not know what I should pray for, nor do I always know the words, but we are promised that God, through the work of the Holy Spirit, knows exactly what is in our hearts—even though we might not. The Holy Spirit works on our behalf. It is a powerfully comforting image of a God who loves us so much that even the words and thoughts we have about difficult situations are given voice.

My friend, Hans Peterson, part of Dakota Road, who will be here on the weekend of May 20th has written a little phrase that I have used in prayer time before. His lyrics go, "The Spirit intercedes for us, with sighs too deep for words to express." For someone as verbal as I am, this little lyric is a great reminder of a need to simply be quiet and pray and meditate on an image of God who never leaves us and who knows our hearts and minds and still loves us as deeply as a loving parent.

The next time you struggle in your conversations with God, not knowing what to pray, be quiet and listen and know that God knows your needs. May you find strength in God's love for the day ahead.



Youth Choirs to Present Musical Sunday, May 13

Join us at 10:30 on Sunday, May 13 (Mother's Day) when the Youth Choir and Alleluia Singers, led by Judy and Breta Saganski, will present the musical *Life of the Party, the Story of Mary and Martha*. The presentation will be part of the 10:30 worship service and will include the Cherub Choir, led by Kim Olander.



Senior Choir to Present Requiem by Gabriel Fauré

Please join us at 4 p.m. on Sunday, May 6, when the Senior Choir of Our Savior's, together with soloists and chamber orchestra, under the leadership of John Hughes, will present the *Requiem* by Gabriel Fauré. A requiem is a musical setting of the liturgy for the dead, so called because it begins with the words "Requiem aeternam dona eis Domine" (Give them eternal rest, O Lord). The program will include some commentary on the various sections of the work. The program will also include two organ works by Melanie Bonis, a contemporary of Fauré, performed by Sarah Kraaz, organist at Ripon College. No tickets are required for the concert, but a freewill offering will be received.

A Short Biography of Gabriel Fauré

Gabriel Fauré was born on May 12, 1845, in Pamiers, in the Midi-Pyrénées region of southern France. His musical talent was recognized at an early age, and he spent his high school years at the Niedermeyer School in Paris, where he studied organ, piano, and choral music and where his teachers included Camille Saint-Saëns.

After graduating, he worked as organist and choirmaster at a series of churches of increasing prestige, until 1877, when he took over Saint-Saëns's post as choirmaster at the church of the Madeleine in Paris. Fauré would remain at the Madeleine for almost 20 years. He also taught composition at the Paris Conservatoire, becoming director in 1905. His pupils included Maurice Ravel and Nadia Boulanger.

By the time Fauré was established as a successful composer and a pivotal figure in French musical life, he began to grow deaf, and his compositional output dropped considerably. He died at the age of 79 in Paris, on November 24, 1924.

Two Quotes by Gabriel Fauré on his Requiem

About his motivation for writing it: "My Requiem was composed for nothing ... for fun, if I may be permitted to say so!"

His thoughts on spirituality in the Requiem: "Everything I managed to entertain in the way of religious illusion I put into my Requiem, which moreover is dominated by a very human feeling of faith in eternal rest."




Quilters' Summer Schedule for 2018


Women's Adventure Group Next Event—Sunday, May 20th!




**OSLC Book Club—

Global Health Ministries Hospice Kits


Hospice Kit Assembly New or gently used items:

- 1 regular-size bath towel (not longer than 48")
 - 1 wash cloth New items: • 1 bath-size bar of soap wrapped, unscented, such as Dove Unscented for Sensitive Skin
 - 1 toothbrush in original, individual packaging
 - 1 "pick" style comb
 - 1 nail clipper
 - 6 Band-Aids rubber-banded together
 - 1 jar or tube of petroleum jelly approx. 4 ounces or larger, lid taped
 - 1 pair heavy duty household gloves kitchen type, size medium
- Assembly: 1. Lay items on the towel and fold towel to enclose everything inside.
 2. Place the wrapped items in a large (2 gallon or larger) "Ziploc" plastic bag.
 3. Include note: "Hospice Kit."



The note should be visible through the bag. Squeeze the air out of
