From Pastor Hansen

"Therefore, since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, ² through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand; and we boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God. ³ And not only that, but we also boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, ⁴ and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, ⁵ and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us." (Romans 5:1-5)

Dear Friends in Christ at Our Savior's,

I was reading the other day about the growing fear of declining mental health, not only in our country, but throughout the world, as the pandemic drags on. It is understandable for lots of reasons, but perhaps it is most scary when we see the effects upon our children. If you are a parent with kids still at home, you know what I am talking about. You understand the toll this pandemic has taken on life at home with kids in virtual school, or some hybrid model and you have had to take on an additional role as tutor to your children.

This anxiety is rooted in a virus that is too small to see with the naked eye and yet has caused so much pain and death throughout the world. At the time of this writing, we will soon cross over the 500,000 death mark in our country. In one way or another we have all been affected by this virus, whether it be from catching the virus or watching someone we know and love succumb to the disease. It is quite simply heartbreaking.

The danger of this virus and its transmission has caused us to change the way in which we live, and I wonder how it will change life going forward. While we can be so thankful for technology that can bring us face to face on a screen, it is hard to replace the gift of personal closeness and touch. Oh, how I wish I could give my mom a hug! I have not been able to see her in person for well over a year, and as she grows ever closer to 98, I want to spend time with her all the more. This is the reality we are all living in: Anxious, fearful, and longing for something normal from our past.

How do we continue to move forward? First of all, if you would permit me a look backwards. As I sat in my office last Sunday following our Annual Meeting, I was reflecting on the year past and I found myself not thinking about all the bad things, but rather on all the good things that have happened in 2020.

I am so thankful for you! As a community of faith we have taken what was given to us and marshaled our way forward living out our callings in a different way. I am so thankful to be a part of this community of faith—to serve alongside our great staff and alongside you in bearing witness to a loving and present God who is with us even more so in the valleys of our lives. It is the hope in this God who reminds us of this throughout scripture. Think with me about Psalm 23: "Even though I walk through the darkest valley, I fear no evil; for you are with me; your rod and your staff-- they comfort me."

One could argue that we have been in a dark valley in this last year. Yet, we set our sight on your loving presence among us. We have seen God at work in amazing ways from nurses and doctors, scientists and lab workers, custodians and other essential workers who often get little credit for the work that they do to keep us safe. We have seen God in the work and determination of teachers who have had to juggle all kinds of new teaching methods along with their risk of some teaching in-person classes. God has continued to work through loving parents and friends who care for their families and neighbors even through distant relationships. Luther used to argue that most people only want to look for God in those moments of success and glory. They want to find God when everything is going right, but that is usually where God is most difficult to see. Luther speaks of seeing God using a Latin phrase, "Deus Absconditus" This means the "hidden God." He said if you want to see Jesus, look to the cross. There you will see God! This year should have given us plenty of opportunities to see God at work.

So, as we begin another year together following our Annual Meeting, I am wondering if we are able to look back, but not get stuck there. We can look forward because of the assurance of God's love and presence. We can move forward because of hope. We now have vaccines that are getting in arms and working our way toward a life that will become more normal. In actuality, Dane County is doing very well in terms of the number of vaccines given increasing and Covid-19 numbers dropping. There is light at the end of the tunnel.

As a result of the latest figures, our Re-opening Task Force has begun to meet to look at returning to sanctuary worship. While we hope that this will become a reality sooner rather than later, rest assured, we will continue to provide a way to worship for the variety of needs and concerns for all of our members. Please keep this group and our leadership in prayer as we make decisions about moving forward. We move forward in hope, knowing that God walks with us throughout our journey. **Keep an eye on emails and our Facebook page as those decisions are made.**

Again, I want to thank you for your continued ministry in your own lives and bearing witness to our everpresent God of love. Blessings to you each and every day!


Lent Worship This Year at OSLC

A Perspective on Hymns When We Cannot Sing Them Together

One of the joys and benefits of worshipping in person as a group is singing together. The result of an assembly singing vigorously is somehow greater than the mere sum of our individual voices added together. There is an energy, a vitality, a unity when we join together in song. Those who feel their voices are inadequate are encouraged as we all voice the proclamation of the text of the song.

So, what happens when, because of the pandemic, we cannot sing together and how can we fill the void caused by COVID? One partial, but not total, solution can be to read, silently or aloud, the text of a favorite hymn, especially one that you have enjoyed singing. Take the opportunity to immerse yourself in the poetry of the text. Ferret out the meaning and the theology embedded in the words. You may discover a new meaning and realize a new and deeper understanding of a song you have sung many times.

Perhaps this is similar to the way an organist works on a piece, learning the right hand part, then the left hand part, and then the pedal part, then combining the right hand and pedal, then the left hand and pedal, the right and left hands together, and finally all together. In each single part and then in each combination of parts, a new and deeper understanding of the piece is revealed.

So, in this time when we cannot sing together, we can practice one part and build a stronger foundation for that time when we can put it all together.


Outdoor Mailbox at OSLC—If

Below you will find a list of items that they are looking for. Thank you for your partnership!

Donations: food

Canned Meat or Fish- tuna, chicken, stew, chili, salmon, corned beef

Soups- chicken, vegetables, broth, chowder

Fresh/Canned Fruits and Vegetables- Oranges, apples, pineapples, mixed fruit, applesauce, grapes, celery, cabbage, greens (kale, collard, turnip, mustard), lettuce, corn, green beans, peas, mixed veggies, broccoli, cauliflower, beans (pinto, blackeyes, navy, black beans, baked)
